

Reading is such a vital life skill and research shows that reading with your child for just 20 minutes a day strengthens children's language and literacy skills. I have been monitoring reading records and have noticed that some children need to read at home more regularly. Our early morning reading club is becoming more and more popular and we have two members of staff on hand to hear children read. We have decided to continue providing the early morning reading club beyond this term so that more of our children can read each day with a member of staff. If you would like your child to come to
