CATHOLIC LIFE - LENT

What is Lent? Lent is the period of 40 days and 40 nights that precedes Easter and is a time of preparation for the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. The season encourages us to remove the things that cause us to be distracted from our relationship with God and the contrast between the Lenten and Easter seasons help us to recognise that Jesus' resurrection is the biggest cause for celebration in our faith. Lent is an old English word meaning 'lengthen'. Lent is observed in spring, when the days begin to get longer.

This Lent out children will be taking part in Lenten fundraising with their class. Mrs Orridge's class have decided to raise money for Dove Cottage; read their story below.

Mrs. Orridge's year 6 class would like to raise money for Dove Cottage by completing a sponsored silence.

Dove Cottage Day Hospice is a local charity and has been caring for adults since 1996. All of their care services are provided free of charge. Guests usually come to us for one day each week. They hove has skilled nurses, chaplaincy support, complementary therapies and beauty treatments for those in our local communities who have palliative care needs.



Dove Cottage has five charity shops, located in the towns and villages of the Vale of Belvoir, including Stathern, Bottesford, Cotgrave, Melton Mowbray and Asfordby and two ebay shops which support the work of the hospice.



When Edith's Papa was poorly, he visited the Dove Cottage Day Hospice regularly, made new friends and was able to talk to his old friends. Because of this support, her Papa was able to talk more and was happier in life.

Miss Stapleford is returning to school from next week. This will be a gradual return and we hope that she will be back in the classroom fulltime after Easter.


Ms Tookey and Mr Stevenson are both leaving St Francis to pursue new roles. We thank them both for their service to St Francis and to the school community.

We raised a total amount of £163 for the school.




WEAR BLUE FOR LOURDES

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Thank you for taking the time to complete our parent survey last term. This provides us with useful feedback and we really do value your responses.

Headlines

94% of respondents said their child feels happy at St Francis.

We are delighted that parents report children are happy at school. Please always let us know if there is anything that your child is not happy about and we can discuss ways that we can support your child and resolve issues.

96% of respondents said that their child feels safe at St Francis. School should be a safe place and at St Francis we strive for all children to feel safe. If you ever feel that your child feels unsafe for any reason at all, please directly contact Mrs Brown. It is most important that you feel your child is safe in school.

98% of respondents feel that at St Francis we ensure that pupils are well behaved. This is excellent and visitors to our school always comment on the super behaviour of our children.

Of 18 respondents who felt their child had been victim of bullying, 94% felt that we dealt with this effectively.

If you ever feel an issue has not been fully resolved then please get in touch with us so that we can support your child.

81% of respondents felt that we make parents/carers aware of what your child will learn throughout the academic year.

We would like to improve this so as well as publishing detailed curriculum maps on our website, we are also sending home half termly overviews in Class Dojo. If you ever want any more information, please get in touch with your child's class teacher.

75% of respondents said that when they raised concerns they were dealt with properly.

We would really like to improve on this. If a concern raised with a class teacher is not properly resolved, please escalate your concern to Miss Curley, Mrs Orridge or Mrs Brown. If your concern relates to SEN provision, please raise this with Mrs Griffiths. We will always do our best to resolve any concerns. If you have any urgent concerns, please contact Mrs Brown directly as sometimes teachers do not have access to Class Dojo during the school day.



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Of respondents whose children have SEND, 46% felt their child was properly supported and 15% were unsure.

We really would like to communicate effectively around the provision we have in place for SEND children. Mrs Griffiths has put together some useful information which she is sharing with parents at our SEN coffee mornings and there is a detailed section around SEND provision on our school website. We will hold more of these over the academic year. If you are ever unsure about what is in place for your child, please contact Mrs Griffiths or your child's class teacher.

80% of respondents felt that the school has high expectations for their child.

We would like all parents/carers to be confident in our high ambition for their child. Teachers meet regularly with the Head Teacher to discuss the progress of all children in their class, with a sharp focus on aspirational targets in all areas. Our ambition is for all children, regardless of their starting point, to make excellent progress, academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually.

91% of respondents felt that their child does well at St Francis.

We aim to work in partnership with parents so that we can do the very best for your child so that they can achieve to their full potential. We are putting on more information evenings so that you can learn more about our curriculum and how we assess outcomes. We hope that you find these useful and also use our guidance to support your child at home.

71% of respondents felt that they knew how well their child is doing at school.

Our parents evenings are termly and we send home a full report before the end of the academic year. We are looking at how we can increase communication around pupil attainment without increasing teacher workload. If you would like more information at any stage, please do contact your child's class teacher.

85% of respondents felt there is a good range of subjects available for their child at St Francis. 14% were not sure.

At St Francis, we follow the national curriculum and our curriculum is designed to ensure that the children cover the full breadth of subjects. We carefully design our curriculum to maximise opportunities for children. There is lots of information around the curriculum on our school website.



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PARENT/CARER SURVEY FEEDBACK CONTINUED

87% of respondents agreed that there is a good range of clubs for their children to take part in at school.

We are proud of our clubs offer and as well as offering some academic support through our morning reading club (this is free of charge to all families and now includes a light breakfast!), we also have a range of clubs to cater for our children's interests. We are continually seeking to improve our offer.

73% of respondents felt that the school supports their child's wider personal development; 11% were unsure of how we do this.

As well as having high academic ambition for all of our children, we also want them to develop as young people. This is supported through our catholic virtues and values, our PSHCE curriculum and through a focus on developing cultural capital. More information around these areas is available on our website.

91% of respondents felt included in the life of the school.

We really hope that this increases as restrictions are lifted. Our PTA are always looking for new volunteers to get involved with fundraising and we love to welcome you for whole school celebrations. Please share any ideas you have for being more involved with Mrs Brown!

80% of you would recommend our school to another parent and 9% of you were unsure.

We hope that for those parents new to the school, you feel more confident to recommend us now your children have been with us for more that half the academic year. We truly want your child's school experience to be the best that it can be, so if there is any further feedback then please do not hesitate to get in touch with us.
