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## OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT IN SCHOOL- BUILDING CULTURAL CAPITAL

We recognise that for pupils to aspire and be successful academically and in the wider areas of their lives, they need to be given rich and sustained opportunities to develop their cultural capital. At St Francis we have identified six key areas of development that are interrelated and cumulatively contribute to the sum of a pupil's cultural capital:

- 1. Personal Development
- 2. Social Development, including political and current affairs awareness
- 3. Physical Development
- 4. Spiritual Development
- 5. Moral Development
- 6. Cultural Development

In school we plan for a range of activities to support each strand of Cultural Capital. We will be updating you about these in our future newsletters. Our Lenten fundraising was a great example of this- giving the children ownership of fundraising for a charity and recognising the importance of giving to others who are less fortunate. We had some really enterprising ideas!

Each week the children have had the chance to listen to music from a different genre. The children have really enjoyed this.

We have enjoyed hearing each class learn and recite a poem off by heart this term. Next Term, we will be asking each class to read a book linked to inclusivity and share a recommendation in the liturgy.

#### PARISH NEWS



Meningitis Now is the UK's largest meningitis charity, offering support, funding research, and raising awareness. Their vision is a future where no one in the UK loses their life to meningitis and everyone affected gets the support they need to rebuild their lives.



Meningitis is an inflammation of the lining around your brain and spinal cord. It can be very serious if not treated quickly. Symptoms include being sick, a headache, a stiff neck, and a dislike of bright lights. You may sometimes get a rash. If this happens, you should seek medical help straight away.

Meningitis is a disease that can strike quickly, but its impact can change your life forever



Meningitis Now urgently need funds to continue their research to fund their multiple research projects across the UK, working towards eradicating meningitis.


Billy was 6 months old when he contracted meningitis after

his Mum noticed he was under the weather with a fever of 40‰c. When they got to the hospital, she noticed the purple bruises covering his legs. Luckily, Billy responded to the IV antibiotics and recovered, but he was left partially deaf.

His Mum contacted Meningitis Now whilst in hospital and they provided support day and night providing company and answering any questions she had.



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Miss Curley's Year 1 & 2 class would like to raise money for Little Princess Trust.

The Little Princess Trust provides free real hair wigs to children and young people, up to 24 years, who have lost their own hair through cancer treatment or other conditions.

Two of our class members this year have had their long hair cut shorter and donated it to Little Princess Trust so that another child could have a wig.

We would like to continue to support the charity by raising money this Lent. We are going to have a sponsored 'crazy hair day' to fundraise for this amazing, supportive charity.

Macmillan is a very important charity, which works to support, care and raise money for people whose lives are affected by cancer and their families too.


