Thank you for your responses to our home to school communication survey. I have provided a summary of the survey results below and our planned actions/ responses to these responses. We hope that this helps to further strengthen communication.

Great news this week from our first sporting tournament this academic year- we came 4th out of 21 schools in the football competition attended on Monday. Well done to our team and huge thanks to Mr Uttley for taking them.

Thank you for your support of our Macmillan coffee morning. As always, it was a roaring success and the children kept us well entertained with their singing. Well done to Y6 for leading this and a big thank you to the volunteers for their great organisation of the event. We raised an astonishing £502.24 which is an incredible amount. Thank you once again!

We had some phonics meetings in school this week and we hope that you found these sessions informative. Look out for more sessions related to key assessments later on in the academic year.

School Communication Survey

Thank you for your responses. Here are the main findings from the survey.

We had 24 responses in total.

75% of respondents favoured a weekly newsletter- we will continue with this format.

Suggestions for other items to add to the newsletter included: house points breakdown (our prefects will be tasked with this now they that have been chosen); results from sporting events (we will definitely share these!); a list of children who have received certificates (we will definitely add this in but will omit full surnames for privacy as the newsletter is published on the website). Thank you for the suggestions.

88% of respondents were happy with the level of communication from their child's class teacher. We value communication as critical to ensure that your child receives the very best from their education and where we have not got this right, we will seek to improve.

From specific comments these are areas we have identified to improve on:

- Ensure both parents with PR get positive messages and information about red cards/significant incidents- this may be through a phone call or Dojo message. Teachers are reviewing their class information and it may just be a case of adding someone to Dojo or being clear on who needs to receive each message. If you feel you have been missed on any communication like this, please get in touch with Mrs Brown directly as soon as possible so that this can be remedied.
- Class teachers will aim to post an update of something that has happened in class each week. Some parents wanted to know an in depth timetable for the week and we do not think that this is necessary. This is because the timetables do change for various reasons such as special events, the weather (PE may need to change), and because the teachers have made the decision to add in an extra lesson or move on quicker than expected due to the needs of the class. Our half termly overviews are there to let you know what the children are studying in each topic. Maths and English lessons take place daily and all other subjects have at least one slot per week. I have included some useful ideas on how to talk to your child about their day below. I know from personal experience that children will sometimes not recall what they did during the day and/or say very little! This is not unusual and some simple prompts may be helpful.
- Provide a more thorough breakdown of after school clubs in the next clubs letter- this will help you to decide if a club is suitable for your child.
- Live calendar on the website- This is already set up and ready to go! Our wonderful IT team have made this possible and I will let you know when it is live....

Some things requested are already available and below are some signposts to useful information.

- More information about our curriculum- Our Whole School Curriculum Map is online and can be found here: <u>Curriculum - St Francis Primary School</u>, <u>Melton Mowbray (st-francis.leics.sch.uk)</u> There is information on the website under each subject area. Please take a look.
- As per our new Behaviour Policy, children receive house points which are tracked on a wall chart in each classroom. At primary school, we find this a clear visual for the children and when they get to 20 house points they will receive a special merit certificate which will be sent home. Weekly mission/star reader/star writer/lunchtime certificates and headteacher postcards home will celebrate exceptional work and achievements. We track

these rewards so that we can encourage children who have not yet achieved an award. If you ever want to check on how your child is doing then please send a quick dojo to your child's class teacher. Teachers will get in touch if there is anything causing concern.

Some other requests

- Taking photos of work that all children have taken part in for class dojo- the most important thing that our teachers do is spend time working with your children. This is what makes the biggest difference to their education. We aim to take an image per week to give you an insight into the classroom and if the same child is included more than once, this is a pure coincidence. Our family big breakfast morning is coming up and you can spend some time with your child in class and take a look at their work. We hope you can join us.
- Dojo points- we have analysed the use of dojo points over the last two years and after consultation with the teachers and surveys with the pupils, we decided to move away from using them and to use house points to line up with our whole school house system. As this is not a digital system we don't have a way of sharing this with parents but the children will know that they have received house points and they will receive a certificate when they reach 20!
- use of social media for school notifications- our social media pages are for celebration of whole school work. We would like to have a clear separation between this and our communication platform for parents. We are looking into using our Arbor systems for emails to parents so that you can keep a track of information received more easily. We know that this is an issue with class dojo. We will consider how this will work but for now, all information will continue to be communicated through class dojo. We hope that the live events calendar on the website will help.
- spellings to come home half termly with weekly reminders- we adapt our spellings lists based on the information from weekly tests. We find that weekly spellings mean that we can adapt and respond more accurately to how the children are progressing.

Accelerated Reader Scheme

Some parents requested some more information about how the reading levels are worked out for children using the accelerated reader scheme. In Key Stage 2 the children's reading is assessed using Star Reader Tests on Accelerated Reader.

This test will generate a ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development), also referred to as a book level, which the children can then choose books from within that range which will be decodable, accessible, and engaging for them.


These Star Reader tests are conducted 4 times in the academic year. Once at the start of the year, and then at the end of each term to assess children's progress. If children find decoding a challenge, they

will be placed onto the Rapid Catch-Up Phonics scheme and will be given decodable, age related books to read.

If you have any questions in relation to the reading level that your child is on, please contact your child's class teacher who will be happy to speak with you about this.

Our House Points are the way that we reward and celebrate exceptional behaviour and work at school.









As always, it has been a busy week in school with lots of learning taking place. Here are some of the highlights.







God teaches us to serve him and love him.


