If you think your child may be entitled to free school meals please follow the link below to find out. Each holiday break, all children entitled to free school meals receive vouchers which can be spent at a range of outlets. This Christmas the entitlement is £40 per child. These vouchers will be delivered to your email inbox so please check and let the school office know if you have not received them. It is really important to note that children in EYFS and KS1 are also entitled to claim for free school meals, even though all children already receive meals for free (confusing, I know). The funding entitles you to the additional vouchers and also adds more money into the school budget..

PTA Christmas Raffle


