I have published some of the photos from the heritage event last week- it was a wonderful occasion and we hope to host something similar very soon.



We'd like you all to make a wreath, and there will be a display in the church porch showing you how to do this using simple household items like clothes pegs and buttons. Be inventive!

We've had wreaths as small as 2 cm, and even a bicycle wheel and a toilet seat. There are four categories in the competition, each with three prizes: adults, children under 11, children 11 to 16, businesses or groups. It's just £2 to

We learned that everything is kept in orbit by the force of gravity and made a model of the Earth, Sun and Moon to help us understand their orbits.






enting This week in Computing, Year 1 explored what

REMINDER Annual Flu Vaccination Scheme

The vaccination is given **nasally** unless you wish your child to have the vaccination via an injection into their upper arm.
