LEARNING AROUND OUR SCHOOL THIS WEEK

Year 3 have been tea tasters and have been describing tea for the Royal Tea Tasters! This is all part of their English work and based on a book the children are reading.






EYFS have continued to enjoy their forest school. They have boundless energy!
