

LEARNING AROUND OUR SCHOOL THIS WEEK



In art this week Year 2 have been exploring the work of Kandinsky. He used a variety of techniques from line drawing to printing. They had a go at creating a pattern and seeing if we could get it to repeat.






Year 5 have been exploring the Industrial Revolution and finding out about the important machines which were invented between 1750 and 1901. The children worked in pairs to put inventions in order from the earliest to the latest using their prior knowledge and detective skills. They were really surprised by how early the London Underground began!

EYFS were treated to an enchanted tale in forest school. They then spent time making fairy houses. They absolutely loved working together and being able to explore for different materials. Mrs Pandit was very impressed with the way they worked together, made compromises and encouraged each other to have a go if it was tricky.

In Year 1 the children have been finding half of objects and shapes.

Cardinal Robert Prevost of the USA has become the next pope of the Catholic Church, taking the name Leo XIV.

Elected on the conclave's fourth ballot, as the 267th Roman Pontiff of the Catholic Church, Pope Leo XIV greeted the crowds gathered in St Peter's Square at just after 6.20pm BST.

Robert Prevost, now Pope Leo XIV, was the head of the Church's Dicastery for Bishops and is the first Pope from the United States of America.

The name the new Holy Father has selected may suggest an emphasis on Catholic Social Teaching. Pope Leo XIII is best remembered for his great encyclical Rerum Novarum on the dignity of labour and the common good. He was a pope who sought reconciliation above all – between the Church and the modern world and between workers and bosses.


PRAYER

May he walk with you, in wisdom and humility, and lead us, together with all God's people, to embody your love for the world. Amen.








