St Francis Catholic Primary School: Behaviour Policy – What Parents Need to Know

At St Francis, we believe that good behaviour is essential for a safe, calm, and positive learning environment where every child can thrive. Here's a quick guide to how we support and manage behaviour at school:

Our Approach to Behaviour

We encourage children to be ready, respectful, and safe in all they do. Positive behaviour is celebrated through praise, house points linked to our Catholic Virtues, certificates, and other rewards. Children are taught clear classroom and school routines to help them know what is expected.

How We Handle Misbehaviour

Minor disruptions are addressed quickly with reminders and calm feedback. If a child continues to make poor choices, they may receive a yellow card as a warning. More serious or repeated misbehaviour results in a red card, where the child reflects on their behaviour with a senior member of staff. Parents will be informed if their child receives a red card or if concerns persist.

Serious Behaviour and Removal from Class

In rare cases of serious disruption, a child may be temporarily removed from the classroom to a supervised space where they can calm down and continue learning. Parents will be informed on the same day if this happens. We work closely with families to support children who need extra help with behaviour.

Sanctions and Support

Sanctions range from verbal reminders and loss of privileges to detentions and, in the most serious cases, suspension or exclusion. We always aim to provide support alongside any disciplinary action, especially if a child has additional needs.

Working Together

We ask parents to support our behaviour expectations and to talk with their children about making positive choices. Open communication between home and school helps us work together to support every child's success.

Thank you for partnering with us to maintain a welcoming, respectful, and safe environment for all our children.

Deacon Keith visited Y3 this week and helped them to think about the Psalm they will be using in RE next week.




EYFS have been learning about how God made us all and we are all very special!
